Press Democrat wine writer Peg Melnik scopes out restaurant wine lists around the North Bay, looking for good value and the occasional splurge. This week's picks (prices are retail; restaurant markup varies):

Quivira, 2011 Dry Creek Valley Sonoma County Zinfandel, 14.2 percent alcohol, \$22. A briary zinfandel with layered flavors and a great kick of spice. Fruit-forward with notes of blackberry, cherry and raspberry. Ripe tannins. Lingering finish.

Roederer Estate NV Brut Rosé, Anderson Valley, 12 percent, \$28. A sparkler with bright acid and great minerality. Notes of raspberry, cherry and graham cracker. Nice length.

Patz & Hall, 2011 Sonoma Coast Chardonnay, 14.2 percent, \$38. A fleshy chardonnay that's toasty but not over the top. Notes of apple, melon, herbs and honey. Juicy.

Iron Horse, 2009 Wedding Cuvee Green Valley of Russian River Valley, 13.5 percent, \$40. An elegant sparkler that's crisp and clean and light on its feet. Complex, with notes of grapefruit, raspberry, cherry and hazelnut. Nice mousse. Striking.



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DeLoach Vineyards, 2011 Olivet Bench Russian River Valley Sonoma County Pinot Noir, 13.5 percent, \$58. A pinot with good bones - great structure. Aromas and flavors of red plum, strawberries and white pepper. Medium bodied, with bright acid. A pinot with depth.
