#### **DE LOACH:** A VETERAN CHARGES AHEAD

Few wineries better illustrate the seismic shift that Pinot Noir has undergone in Sonoma than De Loach. Founded in the 1970s by firefighter Cecil De Loach and his wife, Christine, the winery has enjoyed success with a wide range of varietals in Sonoma County's Russian River Valley, from Cabernet and Chardonnay to estate-grown Zinfandel (with up to seven bottlings) and more. It is now upping its game with Pinot Noir, of which it makes a dozen bottlings.

The redirection is the inspiration of Jean-Charles Boisset, who bought the winery in 2003 and who also owns Buena Vista, Raymond and Lockwood. The focus at De Loach is vineyard-designated bottlings. Winemaker Brian Maloney, 30, credits experience working with the vineyards, upgrades in winemaking equipment and two excellent vintages for the upswing in quality. "We had a couple of nice years to work with in 2009 and 2010," he says. "Now the vision [for the wines] can go with the [upgraded facility]." Also of note from Boisset is the 2010 JCB No. 7 Pinot from Sonoma Coast (92, \$50).
